"Would You Rather? A Memoir of Growing Up and Coming Out" by Katie Heaney c.2018, Ballantine Books \$16.00 / \$22.00 Canada 256 pages

m Y}$ ou're late!

Oops, you overslept, got caught in traffic, the elevator was slow. Phone lines were down, email was down. You forgot, and you're late, sorry. Or, as in the new book "Would You Rather?" by Katie Heaney, your understanding was just a bit delayed. Where do you go when you're looking for love? For Katie Heaney, it was, well, pretty much anywhere. She'd always wanted a boyfriend and she'd had lots of crushes in her life but she was

never meaningfully kissed. At age twenty-one, she went to Madrid for a semester with the hopes of meeting someone, but there were only seven men in the group of a hundred students.

In Spain, though, after binge-streaming *The L Word* and falling for Shane, she began to think that maybe she might be a lesbian. Musing, she messaged her best friend, who let Heaney talk it out and decide that there was a big MAYBE involved.

Even so, she never saw herself with a girlfriend.

She grew up in the cold of Minnesota, had planned on spending the rest of her life close to home, and moved into an apartment near Minneapolis with her straight best friend but that was too cozy-comfy. Heaney on-and-off flirted with the possibly being gay and she met a woman who was, no question, lesbian, which made her decide to shake herself out of her complacency. She visited New York, and then moved there.

Being in The Big Apple was a big deal, but Heaney remained frustratingly dateless. By age twenty-four, everyone she knew had dated and she began blogging about it, she wrote a book, and she noticed that that affected the

way men acted toward her. Four years later, her "attraction to men was just... gone" and picturing herself with a woman came "pretty easily," which was all it seemed to take: shortly thereafter, Heaney met Lydia online, and her almost-thirty-year dating desert became an oasis. She not only imagined herself with a woman, she was with a woman and nothing felt more right.

And now, says Heaney, "I am living with the best roommate I have ever had."

Sometimes funny, sometimes self-depreciatingly cringe-worthy, "Would You Rather?" is a refreshing change over the I've-known-since-I-was-a-child LGBTQ memoirs. Readers may also notice that it's a bit overboard. Author Katie Heaney writes of her journey with a charming awkwardness that endears her to any reader who's ever felt as though the different drummer they're marching to is actually playing the bongos: same beat, different crowd. This book will resonate with all who feel left behind in a world where peers are hooked up solid, and frustration mixes with indecisiveness mixes with self-questioning. Once readers have gotten to the happy not-quite-ending, though, Heaney continues to examine her situation which, while it doesn't completely ruin the books' earlier allure, bruises the story somewhat.

Still, this book is worthy, if nothing but for its unique coming-out POV. For that, "Would You Rather?" fits perfectly for memoir-lovers, Heaney fans, and those who bloom late.

Saturday, June 2nd – Dayton PRIDE once again starts with a hearty breakfast served up at M.J.'s on Jefferson beginning at 9 am. (Cost is a mere \$5.00 donation per person.)

Line up for the Parade begins at 11 am at Cooper Park on the Corner of 2nd & St Clair Streets. Step off will begin promptly at Noon. The Parade will turn right from St Clair onto Third Street and proceed to Jefferson Street where the parade will turn right onto Jefferson proceeding down Second Street where it will turn Left. Once on Second Street, the parade will continue to Main Street where it will turn left and proceed to Courthouse Square to the awaiting crowd of folks to welcome them to our community festival which will take place from Noon until 4 pm. Dayton PRIDE 2018 will include a children & youth section. Third Street will be blocked between Main & Ludlow to create this section. The East end, close to Main Street will feature an Auto Show with both new and classic cars and our all new food court. The West end will feature a family-friendly entertainment. This area will have a tent for face painting and exhibitors geared towards a family-friendly atmosphere. It will also feature a bouncy house for the younger ones to enjoy.

The highlight of every Dayton PRIDE festival will be happening on the Main Stage! The excitement will continue throughout the day, we have a full line up of great local entertainers for your enjoyment! An insightful group of exhibitors will be sharing their information and services and do not forget the great food and drink, and yes, BEER!

Sunday begins with the Annual 5K Pride Run/Walk sponsored by PFLAG at 9 am at Welcome Park in Dayton. Sunday also marks our 3rd edition of Spikes and Heels – A Greater Dayton Pride Kickball Tournament Sunday, June 3rd 12pm-6pm at Jackson-Burns park complete with a Beer Tent & Food Trucks.

Spikes & Heels Kickball Tournament is an exciting addition to the Greater Dayton Pride events! We invite teams of all athletic abilities to this fun, family-friendly, & fantastic kickball tournament! Come in your best spikes or heels to play or come cheer on your favorite team! 


