We spoke of Friday's screening of CIRCUS OF BOOKS and the Gala. Then on Saturday is the infamous TOP DRAWER SHORTS at 12:30 pm and the feature film SAINT FRANCES. A film about an unplanned pregnancy just as Bridget lands a new job nannying the six-year-old daughter of an affluent lesbian couple only to come to terms with the with the true adult in this whole mad cap of senario, the six year old.

At 7:30pm we screen QUEERING THE SCRIPT a filmed discussion of the lack of Queer female representation on television featureing interviews with some of today's top TV show cast members. Then at 9:30 pm SCREEM QUEEN! MY NIGHTMARE ON ELM STREET. The Advocate dubbed 1985's A Nightmare on Elm Street 2: Freddy's Revenge the gayest horror film ever made. For the film's closeted young star, Mark Patton, such a tag was a stark reminder about the homophobia rampant in Hollywood at the time.

Sunday October 13th we begin at 12:30 with UNSETTLED A documentary revealing the untold stories of LGBT refugees and asylum seekers who have fled intense persecution from their home countries. At 3 pm, THE BLOND ONE a story of machismo and ultimate attraction of roommates. And finally the movie not to miss at 6 pm is STRAIGHT UP a story of intelectual soul-mates, one gay one straight and a twisted love story without the thrill of copulation that will leave you with a warm heart and a smile. POZitive Attitudes

There has been a recent up-tick in the HIV+ diagnosis in the region. The phone at our LGBT Center has also received numerous calls as a folks are looking for a support group to address this issue. So the Greater Dayton LGBT Center has scheduled an all new support group called POZitive Attitudes which meets every other week at the Center. It will be an anonymous support group so people of all ages may attend and feel comfortable in gaining the support and information as a HIV+ person. In our greater community we know that stigmatization exists for HIV+ people so this group is here to break down those barriers and offer a safe space to get support, get information, and get help.

This group is peer lead and peer run so you may feel free to talk about any and all issues. We will have a professional advisor on hand for any tough, or medical questions, but otherwise it will be HIV+ folks helping other HIV+ folks with a mandate that anything said within the group, stays within the group.


